Luwiza and her children were devastated.

But Luwiza refused to give up. And with the help of her heifer and all her new skills, she began to build a new future ... not only for her family, but also for her entire community.

For example, her heifer provided about three or four gallons of milk each day. That meant there was more than enough for her children to drink. So she was able to earn income by selling some of the surplus.

This was a big boost. Now she has even bigger dreams.

Luwiza realized that as her herd of cattle grows, she will need to find more places to sell her milk. But Gomani village is nearly 20 miles from the nearest milk collection hub. So she rallied her community to come together and start building their own chilling facility where their milk can be safely stored until it can be picked up by a milk-buying company.

In addition to her leadership, Luwiza is contributing construction materials for the facility which will give the village access to new markets and even greater income.

Right now, Luwiza makes about \$100 from milk sales every month. Primary school is free in Malawi, but secondary tuition costs about \$30 a month and thanks to the income from milk sales, she is now able to send her two oldest children to school.

However, that's not the only impact her heifer has had.

Before she joined our project, Luwiza's crop yields were very low because she could not afford the high prices for manufactured fertilizers.

But as you and I both know, nothing goes to waste on a Heifer International project farm!

Thanks to the holistic training that your gifts help provide, Luwiza learned how to compost her heifer's manure. And ever since she began applying this potent, organic fertilizer to her fields, her corn production has been increasing.

There is another, perhaps even more remarkable impact of the gift Luwiza received

It took place a little less than a year after her heifer arrived.

That's when Luwiza-a widowed mother who once struggled just to put food on the table for her children-turned from gift recipient to gift giver when she fulfilled her promise to Pass on the Gift.

And on that magical day when she gave her friend and neighbor, Helena Gilbert Mwale, a heathy calf to begin her own transformation, Luwiza joined millions of other families who have become allies in our fight to end hunger and poverty around the world.

Life for Luwiza and her community is still difficult. They still have need for a village borehole because water access is inadequate. But thanks to the resources and confidence that they received from generous Heifer International supporters like you, they know that they can overcome big challenges by working together.

I wanted to share Luwiza's story with you because I think it provides an especially powerful example of just how far your support can go in the hands of someone in need.

But our team reported so many more cases of the extraordinary impact. of your giving. For instance ...

· They met a mother named Gertrude who already had a cow, but it produced very little milk. Our strategy was therefore to provide training to help her increase her production from a gallon and a half to over six. With her family's house in poor condition, this gift of opportunity will make an immense difference by increasing their increasing thei in villages throughout Malawi.

- · They spoke with Rose Bamoye-a widowed mother of four who turned the gift of goats and an improved cookstove from supporters like you into an education for all her children.
- They heard from Lucy Timbow who was a Passing on the Gift recipient and has already multiplied the support of our donors even further through a second generation of Passing on the Gift.
- · And they visited Ms. Maiden who Heifer trained to be a Community Animal Health Care Worker. Now she can earn income and also help other families keep their animals healthy and productive.

Of course there were so many more wonderful stories about the difference you are helping us make in this impoverished African country.

That's why I'm enclosing additional details from our team and some notes I received from Allison Stephens who documented our findings.




Figure 15: Written length preferences




